He successfully completed an MA in Screenwriting at The University of the Arts in 2010. In 2014 he resumed his freelance career - acting, writing and directing and has worked for Vienna's English Theatre, Watershed Productions, Prime Theatre, Light and Lark Theatre Company and The Oxford Playhouse, Groundswell Theatre Company, Polka Theatre and Reading Rep.
